
## Overview - HIV and AIDS in the Caribbean

# At the end of 2016, the prevalence of HIV in the Caribbean was 1.3% or 310,000 persons living with HIV and AIDS. Most of the cases (92%) occurred in five Caribbean countries, with Haiti accounting for almost half of the cases (48%), followed by the Dominican Republic (22%).

The HIV incidence was reported as 0.82 per 1,000 population or 17,000 new cases in 2016.

By 2016, the number of AIDS-related deaths had decreased to 9400 deaths compared with 13,000 deaths in 2012.

# **Achieving the Third 90 - Viral Suppression**

In 2016, 162,000 persons were on antiretroviral treatment. In relation to global target of 90% of all persons living with HIV receiving ART, the region has achieved 52%. Estimated coverage of treatment among all persons living with HIV varied across the region with the highest reported in Cuba (70%). Slightly lower coverage than Haiti, but above the regional average, is reported for Guyana, St. Vincent and the Grenadines and Trinidad and Tobago.









Among all people living with HIV, in the Caribbean an estimated 34% are virally suppressed. No country in the region has achieved viral suppression of 50% of the estimated number of people living. However, Cuba, Guyana, Haiti, Suriname and Trinidad and Tobago have reported higher viral suppression compared to the regional estimate.

#### Estimated Percentage of People Living with HIV who are Virally Suppressed, 2016




In relation to actual ART coverage, 81% of all persons who know their HIV status are receiving ART in the region. High ART coverage among these persons, of more than 89% is reported Haiti. Similarly, high coverage is reported for Cuba, Guyana and Suriname.

#### Percentage of All People Living with HIV who Know Their Status and are on Treatment



Among persons receiving ART viral suppression, more than two-thirds (67%) are virally suppressed. Higher proportions of persons receiving ART are virally suppressed in Barbados, Dominica, Guyana, Saint Lucia and Suriname.


#### Percentage of People Living with HIV Who are on Treatment and are Virally Suppressed, 2016
